

The Greenbrier Resort is a National Historic Landmark, welcoming guests from around the world (including 26 U.S. presidents) since 1778. The property features championship golf and tennis facilities, fine dining, a world-renowned spa offering white sulphur mineral water treatments and a casino.

Don't miss an opportunity to tour the underground Bunker, a Cold War fallout shelter completed in 1961 to serve as a refuge for government officials in the event of an emergency.




