Birmingham - Selma - Montgomery - Tuskegee

DAY
Welcome reception and dinner with your Birmingham host and expert at Vulcan Park and Museum perched on Red Mountain looking down at the city of Birmingham. Our expert paints a vivid picture of how segregation in Birmingham unfolded.

BIRMINGHAM

Join our local expert and visit Kelly Ingram Park where police commissioner Bull Connor ordered police to use fire hoses and dogs on children and adults who were gathering to march. Then visit the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute as well as the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church across the street where a 1963 bombing killed four

After lunch learn of why Dr. King chose to come to Birmingham and how important mass meetings were by visiting the historic Bethel Baptist Church and Shuttlesworth parsonage bombing site.

young girls there.

DAY BIRMINGHAM - SELMA - MONTGOMERY

In Selma meet our local foot soldier and author as your local guide.

Visit Brown Chapel AME Church, the starting point for voting rights marches including the events of March 7, 1965 "Bloody Sunday" when 600 marchers were violently turned back by State Troopers at the Edmund Pettus Bridge and hear the first-hand experiences of those who participated in the 1965 Voting Rights demonstrations.

Next visit Tabernacle Baptist Church and another local expert for a tour and presentation about the church whose members were active in the Dallas County Voters League which invited Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. to Selma in 1964. Afterwards, enjoy traditional southern hospitality in the church fellowship hall for lunch featuring staples of southern cooking followed with a presentation about the nearby Gee's Bend quilters. Conclude your visit in Selma with a retelling of events by our local guide

and a walk across the Edmund Pettis Bridge.

Depart Selma along the *Selma-to-Mont-gomery* march route. Along the way stop for a visit to the Lowndes Interpretive Center.

DAY

MONTGOMERY

This morning visit the Civ-

il Rights Memorial and

are welcomed here by a speaker from the Southern Poverty Law Center. 2021 marks 50 years that the Sothern Poverty Law Center has been fighting hate, teaching tolerance and seeking justice in America. Visit the Wall of Tolerance and take the pledge and add your name to the Wall along with other world leaders and celebrities.

Nearby is Centennial Hill. This was the center of African American commerce and society in the 1950's. Here visit the Dexter Avenue/King Parsonage where Dr. Martin Luther King and family resided and raised his family. This is also the site where segregationists bombed the home and where King said the hand of

God shaped him into the Movement's leader.

After lunch join speaker and author Peggy Wallace Kennedy as she tells of her experiences and a new awakening. She has been widely hailed as the "symbol of racial reconciliation" (Washington Post). In the summer of 1963, though, she was just a young girl watching her father stand in a schoolhouse door as he tried to block two African American students from entering the University of Alabama.

Conclude your day in Montgomery with a visit to Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church, where Dr. King was pastor during the bus boycott. This is where Dr. King had his first public forays into movement leadership through his work as chairman of the Montgomery Improvement Association (MIA), which was formed in December 1955 to coordinate the boycott.

DAY O5

MONTGOMERY

This morning visit the Legacy Museum, which uses interactive media, sculpture, videography and ex-

hibits to immerse you in the sights and sounds of the domestic slave trade, racial terrorism and the Jim Crow South of years past.

Visit the nearby Court Square, one of the most significant pieces of property for Civil Rights in the world. Court Square is the sight of former slave markets, adjacent to the square is the Winter Building and from there the telegraph to fire on Fort Sumter was given which effectively began the US Civil War, and the square is also the site of where Rosa Parks boarded the bus which began the Montgomery Bus Boycott.

Visit the Rosa Parks Museum which tells the story of Ms. Parks. On December 1, 1955, Ms. Rosa Parks, an active leader in the Montgomery chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP)—was arrested for refusing to vacate her seat for a white passenger. The Montgomery Bus Boycott lasted from 1955-1956 and is one of the events that marks the beginning of the Modern Civil Rights Movement.

After lunch visit the National Memorial for Peace and Justice, the nation's first memorial dedicated to the legacy of enslaved black people, people terrorized by lynching, African Americans humiliated by racial segregation and Jim Crow.

Later join staff from Equal Justice Initiative as they discuss what EJI be-

lieves and how they advance equal justice for all in the US.

Enjoy a special evening of music with a local group as they share the importance of song and music in the African American community. From the origins of Negro Spirituals to mass meeting and freedom songs, our host carries you on a journey of discovery of how these songs which were sung at home progressed into the first independent black churches and how these songs and choirs supported the movement and Dr. King on his visits around the US.

DAY

TUSKEGEE -BIRMINGHAM DEPARTURE

This morning visit the Tuskegee Airmen Historic Site commemorating the con-

tributions of African American aviators of World War II before a visit to Tuskegee University and the monument of Booker T. Washington lifting the veil of ignorance. Learn of Booker T. Washington and George Washington Carver before a celebratory farewell lunch and southern hospitality in a local restored antebellum home.

After lunch return to Birmingham for your flight home.

HUNTSVILLE

Garden is open year-round and boasts a pictureperfect aquatic garden, a spectacular wildflower garden, nature trail and numerous specialty gardens and plant collections. The Children's Garden and Nature Center contain the nation's largest seasonal butterfly house and eight specialized gardens aimed toward the younger set.

HUNTSVILLE-BIRMINGHAM Travel south on Interstate-65 to Birmingham.

This is Sweet Home Alabama's largest city where a giant statue of Vulcan overlooks downtown where you can find music and roof-top bars, theater and fine dining. The history in Birmingham includes the civil rights struggles from the 50s and 60s.

BIRMINGHAM

Birmingham is also home of America's largest collection of motorcycles on display at the Barber Vintage

Motorsports Museum and the last great juke joint in America, Gip's Place. Other top attractions include the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute, Birmingham Museum of Art and a World Heritage nominated site. 16th Street Baptist Church.

BIRMINGHAM -MONTGOMERY

Continue traveling south on I-65 to Montgomery, Alabama voted as one of the

most historical cities in America. Hank Williams, F. Scott Fitzgerald, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and Rosa Parks all made history in this city. Explore Montgomery's history by visiting the Rosa Parks Museum, the Hank Williams Museum & Memorial, Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church and the State

MONTGOMERY

Enjoy your day in Montgomery by visiting one of the many museums located in the heart of downtown Montgomery. Dine in the Alley

Entertainment district where live music floods the streets or take a dinner cruise aboard the Harriott II Riverboat located on Montgomery's scenic Riverwalk.

DAY

MONTGOMERY -**GULF SHORES**

Continue south until you reach the Gulf of Mexico beachside resort towns of

Gulf Shores and Orange Beach. Here the beaches are soft and white and the water is blue and warm.

DAY

GULF SHORES

Adventure, fun, relaxtio await on Alabama's whitesand beaches. Orange Beach is a hidden gem of 32 miles of soft, sugar-white sand and clear waters. Today you can relax on the beach, go fishing or play golf!

GULF SHORES - MOBILE

It's just a short drive to the historic port of Mobile, Alabama, known as the birthplace of the orig-

inal Mardi Gras celebration in America, Mobile's Spanish, French and Southern heritage mixes for an enjoyable downtown with delectable seafood and beautiful architecture.

MOBILE

Enjoy a fun-filled day with a tour of WWII battleship, the USS Alabama or experience the beauty of

Bellingrath Gardens & Home, a 65-acre estate known for its landscapes and azalea blooms.

MOBILE -NEW ORLEANS

Drive west on Interstate-10 to experience another great southern port city,

New Orleans. In many ways New Orleans is Mobile's twin city, just larger. Both are important port cities with similar histories including a love of Mardi Gras and food.

NEW ORLEANS DEPARTURE

Enjoy a full day at leisure to explore New Orleans on your own. Take a walk-

ing tour of the Vieux Carre, popularly known as the French Quarter, a place of narrow streets, wonderful old buildings and beautiful courtyards. Visit Jackson Square, Royal Street, Bourbon Street and the many museums. Take a full day bayou and swamp tour or enjoy a riverboat cruise on the Mississippi.

DAY ATLANTA ARRIVAL - BIRMINGHAM

Arrive in Atlanta and travel to Birmingham, Alabama, to see the Barber Vintage Motorsport Museum, home to the largest collection of vintage motorcycles and Lotus Elise Cars. The museum has over 1,200 vintage and modern motorcycles and race cars. Spend time in the entertainment districts in downtown Birmingham.

DAY BIRMINGHAM

Sunday morning, hear a spirit-filled Gospel Choir at the historic 16th Street Baptist Church, nominated

as a World Heritage Site. The church is located in the Civil Rights District of Birmingham, adjacent to the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute and a must see for those that want to learn more about Southern history and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

DAY BIRIMINGHAM - MEMPHIS

Enjoy the musical city of Memphis and explore the birthplace of the blues.

Start with a visit to Graceland, home

of the late Elvis Presley, then choose between the Rock & Soul Museum, the Stax Museum of American Soul Music, the Gibson Guitar Factory, or Sun Studio where musicians such as B.B. King, Elvis Presley and Jerry Lee Lewis recorded their rock'n'roll hits.

)AY MEMPHIS

Dive deeper in the birthplace of the blues by taking in a performance in one of the entertaining

Beale Street Blues bars.

DAY Tra

MEMPHIS - TUPELO

Travel to Tupelo, Mississippi for a day trip to see the birthplace of Elvis Presley. The most significant land-

mark of Tupelo's modern history is a modest, two-room house where the King of Rock & Roll was born. From his humble beginnings Elvis Presley began his swift rise to become the world's most popular entertainer. The home is a Mississippi landmark and the centerpiece of the park which also includes, many other exhibits, is the popular photo-op "Elvis at 13" statue and Elvis' childhood church.

DAY

TUPELO - MUSCLE SHOALS

Travel to the "Hit Recording Capital of the World", Muscle Shoals, Alabama.

Rolling Stone's guitarist Keith Richards called Muscle Shoals Sound Studio "Rock-n-Roll Heaven." Visit FAME Recording Studio, Rattlesnake Saloon and see "The Father of the Blues," W.C. Handy's birthplace and museum.

DAY

MUSCLE SHOALS - NASHVILLE

7 Travel to Nashville, often called Music City USA where you can tour Music

Row and visit historic RCA Studio B and Country Music Hall of Fame. In the evening visit some of the intimate clubs in town, including The Listening Room Café and the famous Bluebird Café.

DAY

NASHVILLE

Soak up the sounds in the country music capital by visiting the Grand Ole Opry. Experience the

South's tumultuous history at the Tennessee State Museum. Take a full day to discover the variety of attrations Nashville has to offer, such as Opry-

land USA and world-famous Printer's Alley.

DAY NASHVILLE - LYNCHBURG

Travel to Lynchburg, Tennessee where small town values and perfect Amer-

icana living are alive and well, it might be small, but it's home to one LARGE industry - the Jack Daniels Distillery - listed as the oldest registered distillery in the United States and averages over 250,000 visitors every year. Every ounce of Jack Daniels Tennessee Whiskey is produced here, fed by the pure, iron-free cave water springs nearby.

DAY LYNCHBURG-HUNTSVILLE

Travel to Huntsville to see the largest space museum in the world, the U.S. Space & Rocket Center. The museum has one of the most extensive collections of space artifacts and displays with more than 1,500 rockets, engines, spacecraft, simulators and hands-on exhibits. It is also home to Space Camp.

Travel to Atlanta for your trip out. Arrive in Atlanta and overnight. While in the South's gateway city, visit the world's largest aquarium, the Georgia Aquarium and the World of Coca-Cola.

ΛΥ ATLANTA DEPARTURE

Enjoy a day in Atlanta, which started as a railroad junction in the early 1800's and quickly be-

came the transport hub of the South. Its strategic importance was a large part of the reason it made such an inviting target for General Sherman's Union Army. Visit Fairlie-Poplar, the African American Panoramic Experience, Grant Park or the Atlanta History Center before flying home.

DAY NASHVILLE ARRIVAL Arrive at the home of Country Music - Nashville! Visit one of the many honky tonks (bars with live music) in and around Nashville.

DAY NASHVILLE

Morning visit of the Grand Ole Opry and the Country Music Hall of Fame Museum. Country music eve-

ning entertainment at a concert at the Grand Ole Opry or aboard the General Jackson Showboat with live country music, of course

NASHVILLE -**MUSCLE SHOALS**

Morning departure to Muscle Shoals, Alabama. Arrive in time to enjoy

lunch at one of the many local restaurants, such as Champy's Famous Fried Chicken. Spend the remainder of the afternoon at the Alabama Music Hall of Fame with numerous memorabilia from Alabama natives such as Hank Williams, Jimmie Rodgers, Lionel Richie, Nat King Cole and Percy Sledge just to name a few.

DAY MUSCLE SHOALS

Spend an incredible day visiting the various sound studios once used by many music icons such as the Rolling Stones. Bob Dylan. Cher.

Aretha Franklin, Percy Sledge and many more. Muscle Shoals became a haven for artists who recorded many of their greatest hits, billing Muscle Shoals as the "Hit Recording Capital of the World". Two of the original studios FAME Studios and Muscle Shoals Sound Studio are still recording music today. Not to be missed, 3614 Jackson Highway, home of the Muscle Shoals Music Foundation. Dinner at the 360 Grille with exquisite views of the area.

MUSCLE SHOALS -BIRMINGHAM

Arrive in one of the most vibrant cities in Alabama which holds more live music venues then perhaps

any other city in the state in frequented bars such as Tin Roof, Avondale, Iron City Bham and many more.

BIRMINGHAM -MONTGOMERY

Continue your cal journey and arrive in Montgomery, the capital

of Alabama. Spend the day soaking in the history of Alabama, from the Civil War to Civil Rights at places such as the First White House of the Confederacy and the Civil Rights Memorial Center. Pass the evening downtown in a relaxed atmosphere listening to everything from Country Music to Rock

MONTGOMERY - MOBILE

After a leisurely drive to historic Mobile, visit Fort Conde, a replica of the original colonial fort

guarding Mobile. Spend the evening at one of Mobile's unique and innovative music venues such as The Listening Room or a more upbeat dance hall at Veets Bar or Country/Western at The Saddle Up Saloon!

MOBILE -**NEW ORLEANS**

Arrive at the birthplace of Jazz - New Orleans. Visit the New Orleans Jazz Na-

tional Historic Park and later listen to authentic Jazz at Preservation Hall.

NEW ORLEANS

Morning stroll through the historic French Quarter followed by a Jazz brunch at the Court of Two Sis-

ters. In the afternoon take a streetcar to the historic Garden District where its impressive mansions and luscious gardens await you. Enjoy an evening of fine dining and more Jazz at Arnaud's, celebrating 100 years of Creole cuisine.



Explore the battlegrounds of Fort Morgan, Gaines and Conde', tour the USS Alabama Battleship, or follow the black-history trail complete with an Underground Railroad bike tour.

Mobile-New Orleans

Stroll in New Orleans French Quarter this afternoon before boarding an authentic Paddle wheeler for a lively jazz dinner cruise along the Mississippi river.

New Orleans

With a spooky history and unique, ornate tombs, Lafayette Cemetery is a popular location for movies shot in New Orleans. Or choose to take an exciting swamp airboat tour to see


alligators, pelicans, osprey. Have your pick of music venues, from dueling pianos, to smooth blues and funky jazz clubs

Tonight, enjoy a taste of down home cookin'. Choose from a multitude of restaurants serving authentic southern barbeque.

DAY O6

BIRMINGHAM - GULF SHORES

This morning, visit the Barber Vintage Motorsports
Museum and be dazzled

by the world's largest display of antique and contemporary motorcycles. Now at four floors and expanding, this collection is major eye candy. Depart for Gulf Shores in the afternoon. Alabama's southern border is the Gulf of Mexico and with 32 miles of soft white sand, clear waters and a host of recreational activities, there's no shortage of fun to be found. Diving, kayaking, jet skinning, parasailing and paddle boarding are available.


