

Restaurant Revival: Resurrection Is in the Air at Many Mississippi Eateries

If The Mayflower Cafe is any indicator, 1935 is the new 2026. The restaurant scene in Mississippi is undergoing a culinary renaissance—new flavors and bold fusions are breathing life into historic buildings while carrying iconic Southern fare forward.

The Mayflower Cafe in Jackson is blossoming into a new season. The story of this restaurant dates back to immigrants from the Greek island of Patmos, where hamburger stand-style humble beginnings grew into the building we know and love today.

Enter: Hunter Evans and Cody McCain, co-owners of Elvie's, in 2024. Shortly after Evans was named a James Beard Award finalist for Best Chef: South, they purchased The Mayflower Cafe building and began adding their signature culinary expertise, while also making strategic renovations that celebrate the structure's past.

Visit this scrumptious site to savor the retro neon lights, vintage seafood bins and old-time diner feel (you may recall this locale from its feature in "The Help," filmed in Jackson and

Greenwood). Fast forward to today; the restaurant was recently named in The New York Times' 2025 Restaurant List, which highlights the 50 best restaurants in America.

Taste equal parts timeless hospitality and famous flavors at these other historic, revamped restaurants: The Downtowner, Gulfport; Hen & Egg, Jackson; Walker's Drive-In, Jackson; Lusco's, Taylor; and Community Grocery, Woodville.







Explore a culinary scene where traditions are honored, farmers are family and chefs are artists. There's heartfelt hospitality in every bite.

NORTHERN MISSISSIPPI'S CULINARY CHARM BLENDS TRADITION WITH INNOVATION.

In **Columbus**, **J. Broussard's** shares a touch of New Orleans sophistication. This family-run bistro serves dishes like veal tenderloin scallopini and pecan-crusted catfish.

Commodore Bob's Yacht Club in nearby **Starkville** is all about laid-back luxe. Although there's no water in sight, beachy vibes emerge in seafood dishes, perfect for dinner or weekend brunch.

Slip on an apron at **Greenwood's Viking Cooking School**, where hands-on classes turn food lovers into confident cooks. **Ember & Oak Prime** in **Southaven** brings rustic elegance to the table with bold, flame-seared flavor. Try the Creekstone Farms filet with grilled broccolini.

Cleveland's Oktoberfest, named Mississippi's Best Fall Festival by Travel + Leisure, attracts crowds for musical entertainment, crafts and the Mississippi Delta Barbecue State Championship. The aroma alone is worth the trip.

IN CENTRAL MISSISSIPPI, CULINARY ARTISANS DELIVER SOUTHERN COMFORT WITH A TWIST.

In the tiny town of **Learned**, **H.D. Gibbes & Sons** has operated as a general store since the late 1800s. It's no-frills cooking with tender ribeyes, whole-rack lamb chops and fresh seafood served on paper plates to folks who appreciate delicious food.

Tucked away in **Flora**, **The Briar Patch** is where small plates, craft cocktails and local musicians set the scene. Just down the road, **The Flora Butcher** provides melt-in-your-mouth wagyu cuts for top chefs and home cooks alike.

The **JXN Food & Wine Festival**, held each March at the Mississippi Museum of Art, invites guests to enjoy stage performances and chef-led demonstrations. It's a sensory celebration rooted in the region's rich heritage. Nearby, **Jackson's** Belhaven neighborhood is home to a trio of notable dining experiences.

At **1908 Provisions** at **The Fairview Inn**, menus pay tribute to rural roots with pasture-raised beef, local hydroponic greens and stone-ground Delta grits. In a renovated 1940s cottage, Chef Hunter Evans serves up New Orleans flair and refined Southern flavor at **Elvie's**. A James Beard Award

finalist, Evans prepares standout dishes like redfish almondine. On weekends, the breakfast menu draws a loyal following. A few blocks away at **The Manship Wood Fired Kitchen**, the salmon trails a whisper of smoky notes. Its fire-kissed flavor and delicate texture convey the chef's refined touch. The vibe is casual. The meals are exceptional.

Craving something sweet? Pick up a **Cotton Blues Cheesecake** at a local grocery store and taste why this **Waynesboro**-born dessert is a Southern favorite. Just seven ingredients turn each handcrafted treat into a decadent indulgence.

SOUTHERN MISSISSIPPI PAIRS BOLD FLAVORS WITH BREEZY CHARM.

In **Hattiesburg**, **Big Trouble** hits all the senses with bold Asian American fusion. Try the spicy chicken katsu, the creamy crab rangoon dip spiked with pineapple chili sauce or the chili crisp queso.

Historical homes near scenic bluffs make **Natchez** a popular destination. Even better, each July, the **Natchez Food & Wine Festival** presents multi-course dinners in historic mansions and hosts the popular Tastings Along the River. Consume Natchez's riverfront elegance, then head south towards



bountiful seafood and salty breezes. In **Bay St. Louis, Thorny Oyster** at the Pearl Hotel blends sea-to-table flavors with upscale style. The seafood plateau, with oysters, crab claws and lobster salad, is as coastal as it gets.

Step into **White Pillars**, where balmy breezes drift through a stately 1905 home, and nostalgia greets you at the door. Austin Sumrall, the chef and owner, was a James Beard Award semifinalist in the Best Chef: South category in 2020 and 2025. This **Biloxi** landmark is known for buttery pork steak piccata and wood-grilled Gulf fish. Each bite exudes seaside charm as history lingers in the intimate ambience.

A swirl of savory aroma pulls you toward **Fields Italian** in **Ocean Springs**, where the menu boasts bold, chef-inspired dishes. One whiff of spaghetti with beef and pork meatballs, and you'll understand why people wander in from the street. It's Italy, right on the Mississippi Gulf Coast. **The Lady May**, just down the street, celebrates home-cooking techniques nurtured by the love found in grandmothers' kitchens. Brunch comes to life with a traditional Crawfish Monica.

Also in Ocean Springs, **Vestige** stands out for its exceptional, detail-driven culinary experience. It was named one of five finalists for the James Beard Award for Best Restaurant in the nation. Led by Alex Perry, this minimalist haven is a love letter to regional cuisine, serving fresh Gulf seafood and scratch-made bread in a curated space.

Food in Mississippi is more than sustenance. It's shared meals, laughter and love around the table. Above all, it's an invitation to come hungry, stay awhile and gather memories that taste like home.



Nestled in the hills of **Itawamba County**, the **Fulton’s Cabins at Midway** are a hidden gem for travelers looking to escape the hustle. Think peaceful mornings on a screened-in porch, fire pits under a starry sky and interiors that blend rustic woodwork with modern touches. Across its diverse landscapes, from the rolling hills of the north to the flat delta plains of the central region and the piney woods of the south, Mississippi offers a range of outdoor experiences waiting to be explored. Whether you're hiking scenic trails, paddling down serene rivers or birdwatching under ancient oaks, you'll discover that the Magnolia State is rich in natural treasures.

NORTH MISSISSIPPI

Nestled in **Amory** is a serene slice of nature known as the **Northeast Mississippi Nature and Interpretive Trail**. This tranquil trail system meanders through wetlands and hardwood forests, offering an easy and peaceful walk ideal for birdwatching. Interpretive signage along the trail helps visitors connect with the local ecology, making this spot a favorite for families and nature lovers. Expect sightings of herons, owls and songbirds as you enjoy the scenic stillness.

The **Tanglefoot Trail** in **New Albany**, stretching 43.6 miles along a former railroad corridor, is perfect for cyclists, walkers and runners seeking a scenic escape. miles of paved trail for hiking, jogging and biking. Winding through shaded woods, wetlands and ridges, it's an accessible route for all ages and a peaceful retreat from city life.

In **Hollandale** you'll find **Leroy Percy State Park**. This oldest state park in Mississippi is a true hidden gem. Towering cypress trees, artesian springs and ancient oaks line its hiking trails. The adjacent Wildlife

Management Area makes this a unique spot where hikers can also hunt and observe native wildlife. Campsites and cabins offer a rustic getaway deep in the Delta.

In **Grenada**, the **Lost Bluff Hiking Trail** at Grenada Lake is ideal for adventurers who enjoy a challenge. This loop offers sweeping views of the lake and surrounding hills, especially vibrant during fall foliage. Nearby, the **Lee Tartt Nature Preserve** focuses on wetland conservation, birdwatching and ecological education—perfect for families or school groups looking to connect with nature.

Step back in time at the **Mississippi Petrified Forest** in **Flora**, where ancient trees turned to stone millions of years ago. The shaded nature trail winds through fossilized logs and dense foliage, offering educational signs and a prime spot for birdwatching. It's both a natural wonder and a lesson in prehistoric geology.

Nestled around a spring-fed lake, **Golden Memorial State Park** in **Walnut Grove** offers scenic hiking and historical charm. The park is named in honor of a local World War I veteran and features a peaceful walking trail, plus fishing and picnic areas, making it an ideal place for a laid-back afternoon in nature.

SOUTH MISSISSIPPI

Stretching 44 miles from **Hattiesburg** to **Prentiss**, the **Longleaf Trace** is a paved multi-use trail cutting through pine forests and small towns. Ideal for cycling, walking, running or birding, it's a model of Mississippi's dedication to accessible, healthy outdoor living. Multiple rest stops and scenic views make this trail a favorite for locals and travelers alike.





and fishing on a 65-acre lake, along with a total of 14 miles of nature and biking trails. A well-marked and incredibly maintained 5-mile nature trail encircles the park, affording a close look at Mississippi flora and fauna. The trail is sectioned for shorter walks of less than a half-mile. There is an observation tower at the upper end of the lake. Bicycles are permitted as long as they yield to foot traffic. Surrounded by wooded hills, this park also features campgrounds and scenic pavilions—ideal for family reunions or weekend getaways.

One of the most beloved canoeing destinations in the state, the Okatoma Creek is perfect for a day of paddling. The **Okatoma Outdoor Post** in **Seminary** provides canoe and kayak rentals for those looking to float along

the cool, spring-fed waters. Gentle rapids, rock gardens and shaded banks create an adventurous yet beginner-friendly trip through the piney woods.

Mississippi's natural beauty stretches beyond the eye and deep into the heart. Whether you're pedaling through pine forests, paddling down creeks or hiking along historic bluffs, each destination reveals a different facet of the state's wild charm. From peaceful nature preserves to adrenaline-pumping bike trails, Mississippi is an underrated haven for outdoor adventurers. So, pack your hiking boots, grab your kayak paddle and get ready to explore the great outdoors, Mississippi-style.

Dig into Mississippi's RICH HISTORY

FROM ITS PREHISTORIC PAST TO 20TH CENTURY CIVIL RIGHTS STRUGGLES,
MISSISSIPPI'S STORY IS ONE OF ENDURANCE AND ACHIEVEMENT.

The first humans migrated to Mississippi lands on the heels of the Ice Age, transitioning over millennia from hunter-gatherers to agriculture-based communities. European exploration, trade and settlement brought conflict and displacement of native tribes, and Mississippi's fertile soil beckoned planters who built a thriving cotton economy made possible by the labor and suffering of enslaved Africans and their descendants, whose legacy of perseverance continues to define the state's identity. Mississippi Freedom Trail markers across the state honor its pivotal role in the nation's Civil Rights Movement.

The **Museum of Mississippi History** and connecting **Mississippi Civil Rights Museum** in **Jackson** bring that past to vivid life. A trove of storied artifacts include: a walking stick gifted to Gov. Walter Leake in 1825 by Marquis de Lafayette, the last surviving general of the American Revolution; a rare 20-star U.S. flag marking Mississippi's 1817 admission to the Union; the rifle Byron de la Beckwith used to murder civil rights activist Medgar Evers; and a chess set made of bread and saliva by a Freedom Rider in Parchman prison.

The nearby **Old Capitol Museum** preserves its stately 1839 Greek Revival structure, grand staircases, soaring rotunda and Mississippi's most historic room—the House Chamber, the site of the secession convention in 1861. Research family roots at the nearby Winter Archives and History Building.

The **Natchez Trace Parkway's** scenic route is a ride through its history as a travel corridor for Native Americans, settlers, slave traders and soldiers. Walk in their footsteps at: **Emerald Mound**, the nation's second-largest Native American mound; **Mount Locust Historic House**, one of the parkway's two remaining stands or inns; and the **Sunken Trace**, a section of the iconic Old Trace worn down by thousands of years of foot, horseback and wagon traffic. Marvel at geologic history at **Cypress Swamp**, formed after a Pearl River course change, and imagine life centuries ago at **Chickasaw Village Site**.

LEGENDS AND LORE IN THE NORTH

From the parkway, check out **Trace State Park** in **Belden**, just west of Tupelo. Frontiersman Davy Crockett lived there with the Chickasaw people as a horse trader after his defeat in Tennessee for re-election to Congress, and before he joined the Texas Revolution and met his fate with fellow defenders at the Battle of the Alamo. Channel the folk hero on the park's miles of trails, maybe even on horseback.


Legion State Park in **Louisville**, an area first home to the Choctaws, is a time capsule of 1930s rustic park architecture. Developed by the Civilian Conservation Corps, its Historic District is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and its stunning Legion Lodge, built of stone and hand-hewn timbers and logs sourced on-site, is the standout.

Tupelo's Oren Dunn City Museum, housed in the breeding barn of a former dairy farm, maintains that historic appeal in farming equipment displays, silos and a fully intact 1870 dogtrot house. An old streetcar-turned-diner is another outdoor draw. Indoor highlights include a tabletop model train display of 1940s Tupelo.

In **New Albany**, the **Union County Heritage Museum** covers history across the ages with a great fossil collection, Ingomar Mound site artifacts on loan from the Smithsonian, an expansive "Sporting Life" exhibit, a Safari Room full of mounts and an outdoor Pioneer Village. Its lovely William Faulkner Literary Garden showcases plants mentioned in the celebrated author's works.

CIVIL WAR, CIVIL RIGHTS IN THE CENTRAL REGION

Across the state's central region, get a sense of history both ancient and recent. In **Canton**, a **Mississippi Freedom Trail Marker** on the **Madison**

County Courthouse grounds honors civil rights activist Annie Devine and her lifelong commitment to voting rights and equitable access to education and health care.

Combine a rest stop and history nod on U.S. 49 in northeastern **Hinds County** at the **Pocahontas Mounds** site. Construction and use of the platform mound and nearby burial mound date to A.D. 1000 to 1300. This site served as a regional ceremonial and political center of the Plaquemine culture.

Learn more about **Vicksburg's** crucial role in the Civil War at the **Vicksburg National Military Park**, from campaign and battle to 47-day siege and the surrender that cleaved the South in two and proved vital for Union victory.

The park's 1,400 monuments and memorials honor those who fought, and the **USS Cairo Gunboat and Museum** provide an up-close look at river-based weaponry of the era.

UNTOLD STORIES, VINTAGE FINDS IN THE SOUTH

Don't miss **Windsor Ruins** in **Lorman** for the haunting beauty of the 1861 plantation mansion's column remains, all that survived from an 1890 fire. With recent stabilization work and improvements at the site, view the enormous columns—23 full columns and five partial ones—from an ADA-accessible walking trail around the perimeter. Further south in **Fayette**, a **Freedom Trail Marker** at the **Jefferson County Courthouse** honors civil rights icon Charles Evers, elected first African

American mayor of a biracial town in the state since Reconstruction.

The **African American Military History Museum** in downtown **Hattiesburg**, housed in a former USO for African American soldiers, spotlights their part in the nation's defense, from the American Revolution through the Global War on Terror. Get behind the wheel of World War II's Red Ball Express truck convoy (as did Medgar Evers) or mount a horse mannequin for a Buffalo Soldier's perspective.

Glimpse 19th-century Southern life in the historical mansion and cottages of **Beauvoir**, the last home of Confederate President Jefferson Davis in **Biloxi**, and research the Confederacy and genealogy in his presidential library.

Schedule a **Gulf Coast** visit October 4–11 to see history on the move as **Cruisin' The Coast** marks its 30th anniversary. Awarded USA Today's Best Car Show for six years, the classic cars showcase covers 20th-century vehicle history in nearly 10,000 cars, Model Ts to muscle cars and more, from across the country and beyond. Live bands and daily events stretching across a dozen cities in three counties turn the coast into "America's largest block party."

VISITING MISSISSIPPI, A STATE KNOWN FOR ITS OUTSIZED CONTRIBUTIONS TO MUSIC AND CULTURE, IS TO EMBARK ON AN ADVENTURE WHERE INCREDIBLE PERFORMANCES ARE WAITING TO BE DISCOVERED.

And that's exactly what you'll find, from hole-in-the wall juke joints to outdoor festivals under the stars.

Not all of our performances are found on a stage, though. Legendary master puppeteer and filmmaker Jim Henson, who created "The Muppets" and "Fraggle Rock," performed his puppetry on a sound stage as he turned characters like Kermit the Frog—inspired by the local fauna of nearby Delta swamps—into enduring cultural personalities.

Henson would have turned 90 in 2026, and he's not the only homegrown celebrity with a milestone birthday this year. Comedian Jerry Clower, whose Southern drawl and front-porch storytelling made him a hit in the 1970s and '80s, would have become a centenarian, while actor Sela Ward will celebrate her 70th trip around the sun.

"All the world's a stage," quipped William Shakespeare. If only he could see what we have to offer in Mississippi. Let's explore all the ways visitors can experience original performing arts in the Birthplace of America's Music.

NORTH

The signature event in downtown **Baldwyn**, the **County Line Music Festival**, is an annual, free celebration held each spring, right on the border separating the Lee and Prentiss county line. Featuring a variety of regional acts, from solo singer-songwriters to full bands, the event is a lively, community-driven showcase of music across genres and open to all ages and tastes.

The creative community in **Oxford**, home to a literary legacy that includes masters William Faulkner, Donna Tartt and John Grisham, celebrates the art of independent cinema with the **Oxford Film Festival**. Seventy-five miles southeast in **Starkville**, the **Magnolia Independent Film Festival**, founded in 1997 and still going strong today, also showcases the work of independent filmmakers.

At **Hollywood Memorabilia**, located in **Tunica's** Hollywood Casino, visitors will find the Mid-South's largest collection of authentic movie memorabilia. The free exhibit includes the time-hopping DeLorean driven by Michael J. Fox in "Back to

the Future,” a model of the Titanic as it sank in the northern Atlantic Ocean and costumes worn by actors in “Forrest Gump” and “The Terminator.”

The **Bologna Performing Arts Center** at Delta State University in the central Delta town of **Cleveland** has hosted world-class touring acts like Jason Isbell and the 400 Unit, Tedeschi Trucks Band and Kool & the Gang. The modern theater, which Mississippi magazine named the Best Performing Arts Venue in the state, seats 1,100 without a bad seat in the house.

Clarksdale is home to a lot more than the blues. One of its famous non-musicians, the playwright Tennessee Williams, spent his formative years here and visited often once his family moved away. In fact, he based many of the outlandish characters and scenes from plays like “A Streetcar Named Desire”

and “Cat on a Hot Tin Roof” on people he encountered in Clarksdale. Every autumn since 1992, the **Mississippi Delta Tennessee Williams Festival** has hosted productions of his plays from touring and local theater companies.

CENTRAL

Entertainment is abundant in the capital region, where a wealth of restaurants, clubs and other attractions keep visitors streaming to **Jackson** neighborhoods like the **Belhaven** and **Fondren** districts. While the region is known for its signature soulful blues music, comedians like Rita Brent are regulars—the laughs are big at **Jackson’s MikeTown Comedy Club**, which hosts talent from across the region. For more dramatic fare, head to the intimate **Black Rose Theatre Company**, now in its 34th season, located in downtown **Brandon**.



DULING HALL, JACKSON

Mark the birthday of Jim Henson, the pride of **Leland**, with a visit to the annual **Leland FrogFest**. A celebration of the origins of his most famous creation, Kermit the Frog, this festival is held in the town center near the Rainbow Connection Bridge spanning Deer Creek, named for the song from his 1979 smash hit “The Muppet Movie.”

Meridian has given the world its share of celebrities, including Jimmie Rodgers, known worldwide as the father of country music. Emmy-winning actor Sela Ward, though, is the city’s most visible export today. The star of TV programs “CSI: NY” and “FBI,” who’s also appeared in feature films like “The Fugitive” and “The Day After Tomorrow,” even has her own boulevard—**Sela Ward Parkway**. Visitors can cruise the parkway to some of Meridian’s cultural and culinary hot spots, such as Weidmann’s Restaurant and the Mississippi Arts & Entertainment Experience, which celebrates and honors the state’s legends of sound, stage and page—telling the story of the remarkable impact of Mississippi’s creative legacy.

Like many places in Mississippi, **Vicksburg** is home to a profound musical legacy. And native son Willie Dixon, who wrote and performed some of the best-known standards of Chicago blues, is one of the most beloved. Vicksburg’s “Gold in the Hills” production will celebrate with its 90th season this year. The **Music and Culture Festival**, held at the Vicksburg

Convention Center downtown, celebrates the River City's artistic legacy with visual art displays, live music from performers like Grammy-winner Bobby Rush and a Youth Talent Search.

SOUTH

The 100 Men Hall in **Bay St. Louis** was once a thriving venue on the Chitlin' Circuit, the loose network of juke joints and concert halls that hosted blues and R&B acts like Ray Charles, James Brown and Etta James in the segregated South. James Booker, a New Orleanian who learned to play piano in town, was another popular draw. Now, every Labor Day weekend, the hall hosts **Booker Fest**, a three-day celebration of the legacy of the musical genius who mentored performers such as Dr. John and Harry Connick, Jr.

Take a short drive east to **Biloxi** for the annual **Crawfish Music Festival** on the

grounds of the Mississippi Coast Coliseum and Convention Center. Combining the local delicacy—boiled to perfection by the sackful in an enticing array of aromatic Cajun spices—with live music has been a recipe for success for decades. Whether you pick country music night or rock night, or both, you won't leave unsatisfied.

Pascagoula, birthplace of the late Jimmy Buffett, is also home to the river that lent the city its name, the last free-flowing river watershed in the U.S. Take a break from exploring the maze of bayous in the Pascagoula River's delta for the **Free Flowin' Fest**, a gathering featuring live music, games, a classic car show and plenty of local cuisine.







With 218 Blues Trail markers and 44 Country Music Trail markers dotting the landscape, your musical journey awaits.

GATEWAY TO THE BLUES MUSEUM, TUNICA

NORTH MISSISSIPPI

Start your pilgrimage at the **Gateway to the Blues Museum** on **Highway 61** in **Tunica**, where you can record your own blues song. Then cruise to **Clarksdale**, birthplace of American blues and home of Mississippi's oldest music museum, the **Delta Blues Museum**. Since 1979, this space has preserved the stories that shaped a genre, celebrating 47

years of blues history in 2026. Just down **Highway 61**—that legendary “blues highway” immortalized by musicians from Roosevelt Sykes to Bob Dylan—you'll find yourself tracing the footsteps of B.B. King, Robert Johnson and Muddy Waters.

In **Indianola**, the **B.B. King Museum** tells the story of Riley King's transformation

from Delta farm boy to international icon. **Tupelo** beckons with **Elvis Presley's birthplace**, where the King of Rock 'n' Roll first dreamed beneath Mississippi stars. The “**Becoming**” **statues** capture his journey from barefoot boy to global superstar.

CENTRAL MISSISSIPPI

Jackson pulses with living music traditions. Every Monday night, **Hal & Mal's Red Room** transforms into blues heaven during the **Central Mississippi Blues Society's Blue Monday sessions**. Local legends like **Jesse Robinson**—honored with his own **Blues Trail marker** at Hal & Mal's—helped establish this vibrant scene that nurtures new generations of musicians.

Philadelphia houses **Marty Stuart's**

Congress of Country Music, a world-class tribute to country's cultural heritage featuring over 20,000 artifacts. In **West Point**, the **Black Prairie Blues Museum** offers an intimate journey through rare memorabilia and authentic blues atmosphere. And don't miss **Pops Staples Blues Trail marker** on Summit Street in **Winona**.

SOUTH MISSISSIPPI

Hattiesburg claims bragging rights as a birthplace of rock 'n' roll, where the **Mississippi Jook Band** recorded revolutionary sounds in 1936—decades before rock exploded nationwide. Today, the city honors country music royalty with **markers** celebrating songwriter **Craig Wiseman** and pedal steel legend **Lloyd Green**, both Mississippi natives who shaped Nashville's sound.

McComb's newest **Blues Trail marker**

celebrates **Mr. Sipp**, the gospel-turned-blues sensation who won the International Blues Challenge and earned Grammy recognition. **Port Gibson** remembers the **Rabbit Foot Minstrels**, the traveling show that spread blues across the South featuring legends like Ma Rainey and Louis Jordan.

Create your own cultural trails in Mississippi. Wander among wafting notes of country, blues or rock, plus learn about the legends and living legacies we celebrate in every corner of the state. Press pause on your everyday details—hit play on the soundtrack of your life.

Although some counties in Mississippi remained “dry” well into the 21st century, Mississippi’s craft cocktail culture is not only alive—it’s inventive, ambitious and delightfully experimental. Its Prohibition history is scandalous and rife with moonshine runs and gangster lore, but for adventurous visitors, a fantastic drink is never far away—especially with pro-level travel tips.

NIGHTBIRD


Beyond a glass door at The Oliver Hotel, Nightbird is **Oxford’s** sultry, design-forward speakeasy. Step through a vestibule wallpapered in artful deception and into a moody room of navy velvet, cognac leather and blooming persimmon trees. Here, the cocktails are as thoughtful as the interiors. Discover playful variations on the classics such as a brown butter-washed bourbon Old Fashioned infused with toasted pecans and stirred with cinnamon maple syrup—pure Mississippi in a glass. Seasonal cocktails use local ingredients, while mini burgers from Chef Joel Miller’s kitchen are an unexpected highlight. Every pour is personal. If you know where to look, Nightbird is one of the South’s most artful cocktail escapes.

THE GUEST ROOM

Tucked beneath Restaurant Tyler with no exterior signage, The Guest Room is Mississippi’s original speakeasy and **Starkville’s** most atmospheric secret. Accessible only through the back alley, the space pairs moody lighting with copper, brown leather and vintage New Orleans touches. The bar team serves up seasonally rotating cocktails alongside a passionately curated bourbon list—one of Mississippi’s best. Signature bites from upstairs, like catfish eggrolls and barbecue okra, complete the experience. Visit in winter for Miracle Under Main Street, a festive holiday takeover with cheeky decor, and don’t miss the “Ghost Room” for Halloween. Cozy and full of charm, The Guest Room is where bourbon dreams and speakeasy stories converge.

THE BRIAR PATCH

Off the beaten path in **Madison County**, The Briar Patch is a New Orleans-style cocktail tavern wrapped in Mississippi soul. This handsome hideaway delivers vintage charm and proper cocktails with serious pedigree. House originals like the Peace Street Parlay with Cathead Vodka reflect the bar’s local spirit, while classics like the French 75 are crafted with reverence.

THE THOMPSON HOUSE SPEAKEASY

Tucked underground in the historic Thompson House Inn on **Leland's** Deer Creek, this basement speakeasy is a time capsule straight out of the Roaring '20s, when cotton was king in the Delta. Hello, art deco! Drenched in dark Inverness green, this miniscule bar with a mahogany bar top is warm and intimate. With nods to the original homeowners, Wood and Idella Thompson, the basement now holds more than family secrets—it's a handcrafted cocktail destination with

vintage spirit, where the old Delta gentry gathers for drinks before and after dinner. Sip on Wood's Old Fashioned garnished with fresh rosemary or the King Cotton—a smoked bourbon cocktail infused with lavender.

THE WILBUR BAR

Slip behind a swinging bookshelf and into The Wilbur Bar, where coastal cool meets Prohibition charm inside The Roost, a boutique hotel in downtown **Ocean Springs**. Cheers!



Over in **Houston**, the **Spring Flywheel Festival** is more than just engines



Dr. Roderick Little, Director of Bands at Jackson State University, relishes Mississippi's rich blues history, an inspiration for his career. He cites the city of Jackson, his family and his students as further sources of inspiration and joy, and he is proud of all The Sonic Boom of the South has recently accomplished.

Q: In your spare time, what's your favorite thing to do or place to go in Mississippi?

A: This is somewhat of an unorthodox statement, and I believe more people are coming to realize this for themselves, but I love being in Jackson. Though I reside in Florence, Mississippi, I relish the opportunity to not only work in Jackson, but also to help strengthen and build its community. My responsibility to our students and community can be very demanding, so my favorite thing to do is to be with my family, often at home, or any place that life takes us to in Mississippi.

Q: Which parts of Mississippi's history, landscape or culture have inspired you in your career?

A: Obviously, Mississippi is the birthplace of the blues, so automatically, out of the necessity of connection, the spirit of music that resides in Mississippi has had a profound inspiration on my career.

Q: The Sonic Boom of the South has been recognized on a national level this year with the Super Bowl, the Rose Parade and Coachella. What does this mean for Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs)?

A: It's monumental for all HBCUs and speaks about the impact we have not only on our institutions but the world. We're humbled to have all these amazing opportunities for our students at Jackson State, but there are other HBCUs that have accomplished some of the same accolades. With this newfound attention on HBCU bands, I ask that people see their worth and come together to help support our students and program financially.

Q: What do you enjoy most about your work as you help shape the cultural future of Mississippi through your students?

A: It's just that—being able to shape the future of our great state and nation by working with a wide array of talented students. Whitney Houston said it best, "children are our future," and I have the great opportunity to honor those lyrics, contribute directly to Jackson's future and the state of Mississippi, because our students are also invested.



Where Variety and Elegance Converge: History, Outdoors and Artistic Options Collide in South Mississippi

South Mississippi is full of Southern charm and a deep sense of history and culture. Here you'll find everything from historic homes and powerful civil rights sites to outdoor events and artistic celebrations—all set against a backdrop of beautiful scenery. Visitors to South Mississippi are greeted with a landscape filled with history, public memorials and cultural landmarks, along with plenty of opportunities to hunt, fish and explore outdoors. Each place tells a story—some celebratory, others solemn, but all significant to the Southern experience.

SIGHTS TO SEE

In **Natchez**, visit the recently renovated **Magnolia Hall**, which was constructed in the late 1850s and was named after the plaster magnolia blossoms

that appear in the parlor ceiling centerpieces.

Also in **Natchez** is the **Proud to Take a Stand** monument, a powerful tribute to the more than 400 African American citizens wrongfully jailed during a 1965 civil rights protest. The monument honors those who, despite facing arrest and intimidation, stood firm in their demand for voting rights and equality. Set in a public park, the site is a must-see for those seeking to understand Mississippi's role in the broader Civil Rights Movement.

Further east in **Hattiesburg**, the **Vernon Dahmer Memorial** pays tribute to a man whose courage helped shape civil rights progress in Mississippi. A local businessman



and NAACP leader, Vernon Dahmer championed voting rights for African American citizens in the face of grave danger. In 1966, he was murdered by the Ku Klux Klan after declaring, "If you don't vote, you don't count." His legacy lives on at the site of the Vernon Dahmer Freedom Trail marker, located at the site of his former home and store.

During the 60th anniversary of Dahmer's death in 2026, efforts are underway to commemorate his legacy with new educational initiatives and community events. These efforts serve as a reminder that the region's history is not static but alive—constantly reinterpreted and reengaged by new generations.

South Mississippi, in all its complexity, offers more than just scenic drives. It offers stories that matter and moments that last a lifetime.

This stylish shop curates small-batch gourmet goods alongside custom hats, beautiful art, pottery and handmade gifts by local artists. It's equal parts gallery, kitchen and community gathering space. Whether you're looking for Mississippi-made hot sauces or artisan olive oils, you'll leave with something delicious and beautifully crafted.

In **Hattiesburg**, creativity spills onto every corner. The **Hattiesburg Pocket Museum** may be small in size, but it's packed with personality. Tucked away in an alley downtown, this hidden gem showcases rotating exhibits that are clever and completely unexpected. Right outside, you'll find the city's growing collection of **public murals**, which turn the streets into an open-air gallery. Snap a photo at the iconic "Greetings from Hattiesburg" mural, or just take a stroll and let the colors guide you.

A short drive away in **Laurel**, art is just as central to the town's identity. Mississippi native **Adam Trest**, whose delicate and nature-inspired artwork has earned national attention, is based here. His illustrations often highlight the flora and fauna of the Deep South, with a style that feels both nostalgic and fresh. Laurel's downtown is also covered in **vibrant murals**, each one

telling part of the town's story—perfect for a relaxed afternoon wander.

But it's not just the visual arts that thrive here. The literary scene has deep roots, too. Visit former Poet Laureate **Natasha Trethewey's** Mississippi Writers Trail marker in **Gulfport**.

Just around the corner, **Southern Antiques** is the kind of place where every corner holds a surprise, from vintage glassware to delightful furniture and Southern-made keepsakes.

If you're the kind of traveler who enjoys discovering a place through its creative heartbeat, Southern Mississippi is ready to inspire. So whether you're admiring a hand-painted mural or browsing for the perfect retail find, Southern Mississippi invites you to slow down and savor the creativity that runs deep through its veins. Arts and culture aren't just tucked into galleries here—they're woven into everyday life. And the shopping? Well, let's just say you might want to bring an extra suitcase.

In **Biloxi**, lace up your running shoes for the **2026 Harley Half Marathon**, a coastal run that's both challenging and beautiful, winding past historic sites and waterfront views. Also in Biloxi, the **Tunnel to Towers 5K** returns in 2026 to honor first responders and military

heroes. It's more than a run—it's a powerful community experience.

Up the river in **Natchez**, the **2026 Natchez Balloon Festival** offers a colorful mix of outdoor beauty and fun festivities. The weekend includes family-friendly activities and unbeatable views of hot air balloons floating through the Mississippi skies. It's a great excuse to stretch your legs and enjoy the scenery.

Q: How is Mississippi represented in your inspiration, creative process, cooking style or in particular dishes?

A: Of course the bounty we receive from the Gulf is a constant wellspring, but we also try and attune ourselves to the natural flora that ebbs and flows through the seasons...it gives us a sense of time and place when creating menus.

Q: What made you want to be a chef, and what continues to motivate you?

State Fishing Lakes have paved boat launching ramps and abundant bank fishing areas, including handicap accessible fishing piers.






