blues and America's oldest and largest brewery, the Anheuser Busch Brewery.


And of course the well-known Route 66, which runs through the state for more

In addition, the state has beautiful landscapes that can be seen at Lake of Ozarks or on the Katy Trail. There are also nice places, such as St. Robert and Waynesville, Carthage, Independence, St. Joseph, St. Charles, Hannibal, Cape Girardeau and Springfield. And vibrant music cities, such as Branson, St. Louis and Kansas City, where there is plenty of live music.





MANY MUSIC DESTINATIONS!

St. Louis is the great city of the blues and has more than 40 professional theater companies, as well as a symphony orchestra, an opera company and several touring Broadway shows. The National Blues Museum is a must for blues fans. The museum showcases every aspect of blues music and allows visitors to enjoy live music, interactive and visual exhibits, artifacts, lectures and much more.



In the summer, it's fun to visit America's largest open-air theater, The Muny, for an inspired musical. Kansas City is all about jazz! The city is home to the American Jazz Museum and the 18th & Vine Historic Jazz District.

Country music, rock and pop fans will need to travel to Branson, which is known for its live concerts and has the reputation of 'Live Music Show Capital'.







THE FAMOUS ROUTE 66

Missouri is also home to a large stretch of Route 66, one of the most famous roads in the US nicknamed 'The Mother Road'. Route 66 opened in 1926 as a route connecting rural communities to the larger cities across America. The quintessential American road trip was born! Route 66 is no longer an official highway, but many travelers have not forgotten this scenic road with countless opportunities for fun stops along the way. In 2026, Route 66 will celebrate its 100th anniversary, which will hopefully be celebrated in a big way!

Route 66 originates in Springfield and also runs through St. Louis in Missouri. Don't forget to stop along the way to discover the other charming towns close to the trail in Missouri.




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HIGHWAY 36


Another destination for a leisurely road trip is

NORTH EAST MISSOURI - WHAT TO DISCOVER IN ST. LOUIS

St. Louis is known for its many attractions, including the Forest Park, Union Station, The Old Courthouse, St. Louis Zoo, the National Blues Museum and the famous Gateway Arch. In addition, the city organizes special events and there is a real baseball culture by the fans of the Cardinals.

The Forest Park is full of historical museums, golf courses, tennis courts, playgrounds, restaurants and plenty of nature for walking, running or boating. You will also find the Jewel Box in the park. This is an Art Deco greenhouse with a 15 meter high ceiling made of glass. In short, there is plenty to do in the park for everyone!

It is also nice to visit the Old Chain of Rocks Bridge, which opened in 1929 and served as the junction of Route 66 across the Mississippi. From the bridge, you can drive towards the Eads Bridge at Laclede's Landing, a historic riverside neighborhood with local shops and restaurants and a stone's throw from the famous Gateway Arch.

It is recommended to go up and watch a beautiful panoramic view from the top!



CENTRAL-MISSOURI - LAKE OF THE OZARKS

Centrally located in Missouri is the state's largest State Park, Lake of the Ozarks. This park is ideal for fishing, swimming, walking and cycling. You will find no less than 1770 km of coastline, where you can follow the Coakley Hollow Fen Natural Area Trail.

At Lake of the Ozarks you can go boating, golfing, shopping or taking part in any other recreational activity. From paragliding to water skiing, this area offers fun for all the family. You can stay in one of the accommodations on the lake, dine in various restaurants and visit an entertainment venue in the evening. In short, a stay at the lake is an absolute must-do!





CENTRAL-MISSOURI - ST. ROBERT & WAYNESVILLE

The places St. Robert and Waynesville combine well with the Ozarks.

They are located in the Pulaski County with beautiful scenery with many outdoor possibilities and a unique history, such as of course that of Route 66. On the way to St. Robert and Waynesville you will encounter several nice towns, such as Devils Elbow. Or visit the John B. Mahaffey Museum Complex in Fort Leonard Wood.







Divers around the world want to explore Roubidoux Springs and Underwater Cave, tucked under a cliff in Laughlin Park. Don't like diving? Then go fishing, floating or canoeing at Gasconade or Big Piney. These rivers are perfect for a day out with the whole family.



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NORTHWEST MISSOURI - LIVELY KANSAS CITY



Cave and Nature Trail. This is a 1.5 mile (2.5 km) electric cart

ride along the impressive rock formations. Along the way you

will see beautiful views of Table Rock Lake and the waterfalls.





SOUTHWEST MISSOURI WHAT TO DISCOVER IN SPRINGFIELD

Springfield is recognized as the official birthplace of Route 66 and should not be missed on a visit to Missouri. Discover more about the Mother Road and visit the History Museum on the Square,

Shoppers should head to the Bass Pro Shops Outdoor World, where you should of course visit the Wonders of Wildlife National Museum & Aquarium. The museum opened in 2017 and was named the # 1 Best New Attraction in America. In this museum you will find 35,000 live fish, mammal reptiles, birds and other wild animals. The perfect getaway for the whole family!

Or go to the Fantastic Caverns, the only cave in North America big enough to drive through. During a 50-minute tour you will be in a tram, which is pulled by a jeep!



SOUTHWEST MISSOURI - CARTHAGE

Carthage is a unique city and has special architecture, history and art. Founded in 1842, the city was burned to the ground during the American Civil War and then rebuilt in the Victorian era. This has ensured that the city is now full of beautiful architecture.

In addition, the city is home to a stretch of Route 66. Near Route 66, Carthage has the following attractions: Kellogg Lake, Historic Carthage Square, Carthage Civil War Museum, Jasper County Courthouse, Precious Moments Chapel, Powers Museum, Red Oak II and the 66 Drive-In Theater.

















Cape Girardeau is a vibrant town in southeastern Missouri on the Mississippi. It is the largest city between St. Louis and Memphis. In the city you will find more than 250 years of rich history and heritage. Near Cape Girardeau, you can hike part of the Trail of Tears National Historic Trail or hike one of Missouri's four remaining covered bridges. The historic downtown is full of unique vintage antique shops and inspiring murals.





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SOUTHEAST MISSOURI - THE WINE REGION AT STE. GENEVIEVE

A gem that should not be forgotten is Ste. Genevieve in the southeast of the state. This charming town takes you back in the past through the French colonization and beautiful buildings. A visit to the Ste. Genevieve National Historic Park gives you all the information about the French settlers and local history.





In addition, the region is known for its vineyards and wineries on the Route Du Vin Wine Trail. Visit the Chaumette vineyard and taste the various wines that have won awards. A nice trip for people who love wine!

Missouri's most famous grape is Norton, and a whopping 21% of the grapes grown in this state belong to this grape variety. Annually, Missouri's 125 wineries produce more than 1.25 million wine, so sampling a glass of wine in this region is highly recommended!



ROUTE: KATY TRAIL STATE PARK

The Katy Trail is the perfect route through the diverse green landscapes of the state of Missouri. Outdoor enthusiasts pay attention, because this route is no less than 387 km long and very suitable for a hike or mountain bike tour. The trail follows part of the Lewis & Clark Trail, passing limestone cliffs, small towns and several traditional spots of America. Discover and experience the beauty of Missouri's diverse nature through the Katy Trail!













TRY THE REAL MISSOURI BARBECUE!

Slowly grill the meat over low heat, so that plenty of flavor remains. This is what Missouri cuisine is known for. Each part of the state has its own type of barbecue. Kansas City has more than 100 barbecue restaurants, where the spicy meat is served with a thick tomato-based sauce. Because sweet and spicy are mixed, you experience a true taste explosion. In St. Louis, for example, the barbecue is known for its slow-cooked pork ribs covered with a sweet and sour glaze. In any case, there is plenty to try!

In addition, the state is also home to many different breweries, the oldest of which is located in the city of St. Louis, Anheuser Busch Brewery, and can be visited for a tour and of course tasting. Or head to the Boulevard Brewing Company in Kansas City, the largest specialty brewery in the Midwestern United States. On Sundays they organize tours, tastings and Beer Hall Bingo.
